





Ever wonder what the insides of a P1800 steering box look like?



gentleman came up to me and asked if I liked the car, he then said the rumor was that the purchase & restoration costs did not have much change out of \$1,000,000.



How To - Heater Control Valve Replacement

Thought my experience with this issue might interest others in the 1800/ 120 communities (and 140 community for that matter!).


This works for both 1800/120 vehicles though I did this project on my sons 142 - method is pretty much identical for all of the cars mentioned.

The 142 had the hoses operating on a recirculating basis - bypassing the valve - this is usually an indication of a failed valve. Without wanting to get into checking the old valve (at it's age the likelihood it was shot was high), I rummaged around in a 240 being wrecked at GLT Car Centre (thanks Peer!).

The valve used in a 240 (accessed on the passenger side of the heater box inside the cabin) is just about identical, though the way the heater cable attaches is different - the original valve has the cable hooked on via a loop at the end of the cable whereas the 240 valve has the cable end inserted through a drilled bush that is then secured by a screw - simple solution is use side cutters to clip the loop off the end of the cable on your 1800/120!

Other than that it is really a piece of cake - it all screws up to the same holes on the firewall.

You may find your hoses are getting to their use by date and some of these are hard to get or quite dear now. To get the system up and running whilst you collect your original hoses (if that's your thing) you can loop standard heater hose around the place and it will work fine. I found that a commodore heater hose when trimmed to length is identical to one of the original right

angle hoses required - that was \$7 at Repco.

Because it's the 142, I haven't gone looking for original hoses because the system works brilliantly - what's important is that this method is so much cheaper than the kings ransom the remanufactured original valves are bringing through IPD, etc. And for those that are particular there is one thing to consider - the way the cable attaches is not visible - so there won't be that niggling visual reminder that you compromised a bit to keep the heat up in the car. (I guess this is not a top-ofmind issue this time of year though!)

A brilliant step-by-step article in the tech section at www.vclassics.com courtesy of Phil Singher in the U.S. - is well worth printing out and having handy.





Welcome to this issue's 240/260 Series Register Page. So, what prompts a 240 owner and enthusiast like myself to fill this space with 164 content? Lack of fresh 200 Series content from month to month is always a pressing factor, but on this occasion, I thought it worthwhile and interesting to include some great 164-related material that has recently come my way via an overseas acquaintance.

If, like myself, you're one of the increasing number of internet-savvy enthusiasts who scan websites for Volvo-

related content, you will know that from time to time, such activities offer the opportunity to strike up a dialogue with other like minded individuals all over the world. For me, the principle addiction is Ebay which is, for the uninitiated, a website which provides the opportunity to buy or sell a limitless range of goods (Volvo-related parts and collectibles included) via an online auction process. In addition to my own purchases, I have recently sold strut-tower braces to a Californian 240 owner and a nice set of 164TE rear gooseneck reading lamps to an enthusiastic 164 owner in the UK.

In the latter case, I made the acquaintance of a Mr. Bill Gibson who drives a very special and immaculate original white early model 164 which accompanies his late model S40 and other marques in his stable. After purchasing the lamps for his prized possession, Bill has remained in contact and we have enjoyed exchanging pictures and stories about our cars and experiences. Of particular interest has been our dialogue on spare parts and accessories for these early cars. Bill picked up on some special features of my 1976 244 from photos I sent him, and I was able to mention some 164 accessories I have discovered, that don't feature on his car. I know that with a bit of persistent hunting around our local sources, it is still possible to acquire some of the early treasures that have long since disappeared from roads and wreckers in Europe. With time, the only source for these old original parts will in fact be from other enthusiasts via websites like Ebay.

But back to the car in question. Bill's 164, it would appear, is somewhat of a celebrity on the local Volvo scene, and has been featured in numerous publications during the course of his ownership. When I wrote with some details of our local Volvo Club and bi-monthly magazine, Bill generously offered to write an article about his car for Rolling Australia. His words, together with the photos he provided, follow below... It all really started for me at the 2003 Volvo Owners Club national meet, held at the British Motor Heritage Centre in Warwickshire. I'd had an S40 2.0T for some time and was a member of the Club, I also had a bit of an 'itch' for an Amazon, preferably red with a white roof, and a saloon rather than the estate version.

We arrived in the morning, by which time there were several hundred Volvos there, some really old, some brand new. And yes, there were quite a few Amazons lined

> up. However, there was this large white car, bonnet up, and an elderly chap, rag in his hand, and a small group of onlookers chatting to him.

> I was no anorak where Volvos were concerned, and probably didn't even know the model number of the car. There was a handwritten notice in the rear passenger window, the car was for sale. Blue leather interior, and those seats like armchairs. The huge thin rimmed steering wheel. I'd come face to face with Hubert and his 164, built 1969 Sweden, matching 164G registration plate, and his sisterin-law sitting in the back seat, knitting!

I was impressed, started chatting to the 'old boy' who rarely stopped buffing some already very clean bit of that 3.0 litre straight six lump, painted bright red.

Well I wandered around a bit more, looked at loads of stuff, stood envious of the row of Amazons, (until I got up close to some of them, and realised some of them weren't all that special in the bodywork

department, and some were verging on the terminal).

So I did the tour of the BMH Museum, well worth a visit should you ever come to England, and a good illustration of what the British car industry did so well, and in later British Leyland, how they got away with it for so long!

So back to Hubert, and by now the little 'audience' had thinned, so I had a

and the best bit, a little green notebook from the sixties, the sort oil companies and garages used to sell, replaced today by merely a rubber stamp on the service page. The book was handwritten, every oil change documented, every 1500 miles on average!, every rubber grommet replaced and every time they cleaned the brake discs out. A 30odd year history of ownership. I saw the double garage with carpet on the floor,

where the old girl had lived, warmed in winter and dry.

The 3.0 litre pulls like a train, revs freely to 5500rpm and has so much torgue that the gearstick seldom needs troubling. Shod with four new tyres she actually now went round corners, but without power assisted steering was a pig to park. The car had been featured in Practical Classics magazine, where the reviewer said if you don't have big arm

muscles now you will after driving this Volvo. It feels like you could drive through a wall and barely notice. I think he liked it.

Power steering arrived later via contacts I'd made here with similar Volvo fruitcakes, and good old Ebay of course. She starts first time, doesn't complain about being left out in all weathers. Built to survive Sweden. And those seats, height adjustable, lumbar control, reclining, all common these days but not in 1969. And they smell of leather, too. She's made the cover of Volvo Technical Driver magazine too -- I am proud of that for me and for Hubert and his late brother Colin. Without them, the 164 could have finished its days long ago, on a wet and windy stock car track. Banger racers loved 'em.

Hubert still phones occasionally to check up on her, maybe remembers something else he and his brother did to the car, all those years ago.

Of course, I still get the itch for a red Volvo Amazon with white roof and 2.0 litre twin carb engine, and maybe one day I'll scratch it. But this 164 will probably stay with me for a very long time to come. Here's to the next thirty six years!

Thanks very much for that great story, Bill, which I'm sure the 164 enthusiasts among us appreciated! If you have a 164 and would like to converse with Bill, please let me know and I will pass your details on, as I'm sure he would like to hear from you.

chance for a longer chat with him. He told me some of the history of 164G, how he'd shared it with his late brother since early 1971, the trips they'd made in it, one or two modifications they'd devised, the 'discussion' they'd had about the rev. counter on the dashboard. 'Told him he should never have stuck it there! You could always take it off again.' We used to have air horns on it, we found it was the only way to move the sheep when we went to Wales for holidays every year. Oh yes, we carried a spare alternator and spare distributor with us, well you never know, do you?'. Wales must be all of a hundred miles from here.

I liked Hubert straight away. He was obviously quite an expert engineer of the old sort. Knew what micrometers did, and that sort of stuff, could manufacture the odd piece in his garage, and improve one or two things 'Volvo' as well. An honest man from the East Midlands.

I also realised that he loved this car and the memories it held and he was going to decide who eventually became it's new owner. I took down the phone number, and set off home.

Now sometimes it's best to walk away, have a think before you buy. After all, this was a 164 and nothing like an Amazon. It took me about five minutes of driving home in the S40 to realise I should have made an offer five minutes ago, and the car would be sold before I got home to make that phone call.

However... this beaut is now mine, albeit I feel more of a 'custodian' than owner. Along with the car came a trunk load of spares, some of which I can identify,

NO Petrol! What will YOU do?

So petrol is costing us between \$1.20 and \$1.30 per litre and John Howard tells us we will have to get used to as there is no way he will reduce the 38 cent Federal Tax, and the extra cent the State Government gets through the GST on each extra 10 cents per litre is for them to return to the long suffering motorist.

In addition the experts are telling us that when China and India have as many cars in relation to their population as we have in Australia demand will exceed supply and result in even bigger increases in the price of oil ... that is before oil supplies are completely exhausted in 2020 or 2030!

So what are we going to use to propel our Volvos in the future? Change to LPG? Just a moment what does LPG stand for **"Liquefied PETROLIUM Gas"!** Seems that it will disappear along with oil.



Another thought, even in the short term converting your car to LPG is only economic if you have some massive petrol guzzling 5 litre V8 four wheel drive and do some 15,000 to 20,000 km per year. For a modest 2 to 2.5 litre car which can achieve 7 to 10 litres per 100 kilometres the amount of money you will save will take years to repay for the cost of conversion. In addition the excise tax on LPG is set to rise until it is equal to that on petrol. Also LPG will give you less power and less economy than petrol.

The last time petrol was in short supply was in World War II and car owners were issued with ration coupons which had to be used along with money each time you bought a gallon of 60 octane petrol. In Australia and Sweden [and other places] cars were fitted with gas producers which were a strange contraption either towed behind the car or bolted into the boot [with the lid removed] and resembled a solid fuel hot water service. Before starting the car you had to light the fire at the bottom of the contraption and this fired up the charcoal or coke fuel which produced a gas which was fed to the engine by way of a large tube running over the roof or along the running board.

The power from gas producers was laughable and cars trailing a smoke plume from the small funnel at the top of the machine had difficulty in climbing even small hills. Still you could drive for hours so long as your supply of coke/charcoal held out.

In Paris under the German occupation the taxis were fitted with a large flat rubber bladder or balloon which covered the whole roof of the car and was filled with coal gas - the same



stuff as we used to use in our gas stoves in the kitchen.

Forget the petrol/electric hybrids they still need petrol for their engines. Forget solar powered cars - they do not run too well in the dark, and you have to cover the whole body of the car with expensive little solar cells.

I would put my money on diesel motors. But I can hear you say, "But diesels run on oil". Yes, but they will run on <u>ANY</u> oil. Almost any vegetable oil can be used in a diesel motor. Just imagine discussions over coffee at future Volvo Club night meetings ...

"I run my car on olive oil."

"That's OK Jack but I prefer peanut oil - it smells better!!!"

25 September, 2005



Shane and Elaine Roberts Sprite used 16.82 litres, whilst Rod and Karen Wells, who are regulars in their Sprite in the Volvo Club run managed to use 21.47 litres, although Rod thought he must have a leaking fuel tank! A three litre Austin Healy driven by Peter Stanley used 16.20 litres.

mechanics gave everyone's car a thorough check, and quite a few helpful hints. Did you know that the power steering pumps run hot on the S/V70 models? It was pointed out that some of the aluminium sump guards on the market don't have any cooling holes near the rear, where the rack (and pump?) are located, possibly causing things to overheat. Solution - drill some large holes in your sump guard to let more air in and out, but still maintain a protective plate under the sump!

Some of us had a look under James Maddison's 122, where he pointed out the butcher's job on his petrol tank. James, remind us where NOT to go for petrol tank modifications! They don't build 'em like they used to - lots of cast iron and solid-looking axles under the 122, whereas Dion's V70 has some pretty impressive-looking rear suspension bits. Even more impressive was the rear suspension of Tina's 960 - lots of aluminium! I wonder how many suspension bushes there are waiting to be replaced? It probably gives a great ride, but the 122 sure beats it for simplicity.

Mark Hoffmann took advantage of a recent night meeting speaker's services. Remember Ozicozi? Check out the web site www.ozicozi.com.au for a memory jogger. They apply a clear plastic (3M-branded) self-adhesive film on the front surfaces of the bonnet, guards, etc. to prevent stone chips. Mark had the folks from Ozicozi come out to make up some templates for his 240 GLE to facilitate easy installation of the plastic film (purchased in sheets). Mark - let us know how it works out!

It was good to catch up with friends for a chat and to hear about what projects various folks have going in their sheds.
