



In his time at the helm, Mr Desselss oversaw sales growth of 60 per cent for the Swedish brand, including a record 4945 sales in 2010

He will begin his tenure on March 1st. Replacing Mr. Desselss as managing director will be Matt Braid (39), whose history with VCA goes back to 2003. He is currently Sales Director, and has previously held positions with Holden and VW Australia, and also spent time in the Middle East. Welcome from the Volvo Clubs of Australia!

It is encouraging to see that there is still interest in these Classic Volvo models which are relatively unique in Australia and in the


world for that matter.



Brickbats & Bouquets:

NO CAR IS PERFECT (Part 9)

Returning from New Zealand with no car to my name, my father gave me my late mother's car. This was an Austin Lancer [no relation to the current Mitsubishi Lancer]. This was BMC's first attempt to build an "Australian" car in Sydney. I won't go into a lot of detail but sufficient to say the design was identical to the Austin sold in Britain.



To start with it was a medium/ small car and no competition to the full size 6-cylinder Holdens and Fords of the time. It had a 1.5 litre 4-cylinder motor driving the back wheels. The front suspension was independent torsion bars and the steering rack and pinion - these were the only good points in my estimation. The back suspension was a live axle with semi-elliptic ["cart"] springs. The big problem was that the motor was cast-iron and mounted well forward and high in the front of the car. Driving on country roads this meant that the car was noseheavy and the rear very light without luggage or passengers in the rear seats; body roll was pronounced. If only the rear axle had been equipped with a Panhard rod to keep the springs in line. I fitted an anti-roll bar to the front suspension which helped with the cornering. Apparently the engineers in England thought the climate in Australia was similar to the land around Alice Springs hence no need for a heater. I can survive without a heater but I need a demister to stop all the windows fogging up in winter. So I got a second-hand heater from a Fiat from the wreckers and fitted it under the dash. My only problem was that I couldn't get hold of a cable-operated tap – so I ended up with a brass tap fitted to the engine block and at the beginning of winter turned the water on; and off when the weather got warmer. This worked reasonably well

as with the fan on the heater supplied most of the heat and with the fan off and the doors to the heater closed the interior of the car was quite comfortable.

My wife and I made do with the Austin for a few years but with the arrival of a second kid I was informed that the car was too small for two adults + two little kids and all their gear. So I went looking for a bigger car. Second-hand Holdens were either too expensive or too terminally rusty so I went looking for a Peugeot 404 which I had driven in the USA and liked the way it handled. I still dreamed of getting a Volvo but they were expensive and few and far between. Purely by luck I dropped in to a local Volvo dealer and asked if they had any used 122s. They didn't have one at the moment but an old codger had one that he wanted to trade on a new car but he wanted too much for his old car, but he was bringing it in again later in the week. So later in the week I called back and took the car for a test drive... it was like meeting and old friend. The car was nine years old and paint and interior in first-class condition and it seemed that only the driver's seat has been used. So I bought my second Volvo "as traded" for the money the company had allowed the previous owner. In my test drive I noticed a slight hesitation under acceleration which I thought might be a burnt exhaust valve so I told the Volvo agency I would pay them to pull the head off and do a valve job before I took delivery. Unfortunately the problem turned out to be a broken compression ring which had scored the cylinder badly. The cure was a rebore and a set of new pistons. The cost was high so using my contacts I located a 2 litre second-hand motor from a wrecker in Dandenong - the cost was less than the cost of 4 new pistons! So I had the Volvo agency replace the 1.8 litre motor with the 2 litre one. Then a few days later the head mechanic range me to say they had a problem with the motor overheating and suggested the addition of an electric fan to supplement the



picked the car up it was running well but was still a little too hot. Through a bloke in a car accessory shop in the city I got in touch with a guy who ran

a general garage in Frankston and just happened to be a 122 Volvo nut. He drove one himself. Now Frankston was a long way from where I was living but it so happened that he lived a few blocks from my home. So I delivered the car to him one evening and picked it up the next evening - it turned out that the reason for the overheating was that the twin SU carburettors required different needles for the 2 litre engine than for the original 1.8 litre. What my new friend had to say about the dimwits that had been messing about with my car for the previous two weeks was unprintable.

I had the car and the 2 litre for many years without doing more than routine servicing and loved driving it on the open road, although the steering was a mite heavy when manoeuvring in a tight parking spot. One day when my daughter was eleven she said to me "Dad when I'm eighteen will you let me drive your car?" "Of course" I replied, thinking in seven years I would have had several replacements. Some years later it was a strange feeling to see my car going down my driveway with my newly-licensed daughter at the wheel and her little sister riding shotaun.


To sum up my two Amazons were as near as I have ever come to a perfect car. Comfortable to drive fast on long distances with great roadholding and good fuel economy. Fantastic heating and demisting, and with the little triangular vent windows, bearable when driving in the summer.

Before VicRoads had all those concealed speed cameras I regularly drove on my own from my home in Melbourne to my brother-in-law's house in North Sydney in 9 hours actual driving time.





Well you've heard about them on TV and what have you, but here is a real "barn find" 1800.

Mike acquired his 1800 in early 2010, from John Brooks. This fellow had parked his saint in a shed for 17 years, where it sat under a cover. Apparently, it had developed a miss, due to water getting into the tank, and so he decided to just park it. Not surprisingly, this led to a rusted out fuel tank, which was the only major repair needed to be done by Mike when he got her to make her run. Mike also did brakes and fuel pump, hardly surprising given her lengthy hibernation.



The B18 engine is still in its original spec. Yet another example of rugged Swedish engineering that I see so often in doing these profiles. The engine runs quietly and sweetly, just as B18s are meant to.

Mike has owned a 122 in his time, so was no stranger to Volvo when he bought this car. When quizzed as to his reason for buying an 1800, I didn't get the tale about his youth, or such, but



simply because he saw the car and wanted to rescue it!! (must confess to being guilty of that many a time!)

Oil leaks (or how to get your hands dirty and fix them)

Does your 1800 or 120 suffer from oil leaks? I am yet to see one that doesn't, even mine. To tell you the truth, I don't bother about a single odd drop of oil, although I should. But when there is always a small puddle on the garage floor it's time to check out where this is coming from. Here are a few places that I would look at for leaks. First of all check where exactly is the leak on the floor as compared to where the car is parked. If the engine is covered with gunk and oil, give it a degrease, take it for a very short run and when you come back the leaks will be more obvious on a clean engine.

Sump plug This needs a new brass washer every time you drain and change your oil. Don't skimp on this, it's cheap enough.

Tappet cover gasket and Oil filler cap rubber If these have not been changed for a while, they go hard and brittle. You can tell if the oil is leaking from the oil filler cap. Have a good look. Run you finger around the tappet cover. If you finger is wet with oil then you have a leaky tappet cover cork gasket. When you replace this do not over tighten and also do NOT under tighten either. It would be a good idea to just nip the 4 screws up a couple of times after a couple of short runs.

Fuel pump on Carb engines Run your finger at the bottom of the pump where it mates to the engine side, it must come up dry. The combination is gasket, spacer, gasket and fuel pump. If one or more of these are missing or if the fuel pump face is distorted, you will get a leak there no matter what. Replace.

Front timing cover This could leak from the crankshaft seal which is originally the felt type. This can be updated for a neoprene seal after modifying the cover. Or else the leak is from a broken sump gasket. That is not easy to change while the engine is in the car, although I did drop the front end on longer screws once and changed it on an Amazon. Wouldn't want to try it on an 1800 since the cross member is bolted differently.

Steering box This might not drip onto the floor unless it's really bad. Have a look at the bottom of the steering box at the pitman arm. If that and the big nut are covered in gunk and oil, then the bottom steering box seal is leaking and it is draining the oil from the box. If it's not leaking and steering is heavy then someone has pumped grease into the box. That's a no no! Fix it up and fill up with hypoid oil. Look after that steering box, it's expensive to repair.


Rear engine leak If you ever have to replace the clutch, then make sure the mechanic puts in a new updated housing on the rear of the crankshaft using a neoprene seal. That's the only way to fix that.

Gearbox & overdrive besides the obvious front and rear seals, the most annoying and easily fixed leak here is where the speedometer cable hooks up. There should be a unique Volvo seal there where the cable screws onto the gearbox/ overdrive. These go hard and brittle with time. I have seen some cars without that seal altogether. 1800s have the 'L' shaped speedo gear that springs a leak too. Replace.

Rear Diff Two areas to look at here, The obvious rear cover gasket or the front diff seal. Don't be misled by the oil drop at the bottom of the diff at the back and think it must be the rear gasket. If the front seal is leaking, the oil will travel on the slope of the diff to the back. If the front seal is bad, you will also see a bad splatter on the bottom of the car body (and exhaust pipe running past) above the front of the diff.

Hope all this helps. If you want to own an 1800 or a 120 then get your hands dirty and know you car. More next time.




